Saint Tatiana became the patroness of students for the reason that on the day of her memory on January 12 (25), back in 1755, Empress Elizabeth signed the Decree on the opening of the first Russian university in Moscow. The project was developed by Mikhail V. Lomonosov.

“Tatyana’s Day” began to be celebrated first as the university’s birthday, and later as a holiday for Russian students. Since 2005, January 25 has been officially celebrated in Russia as the “Day of Russian Students”.

In Russia, this day has become a real youth holiday, which is celebrated by all students. And the Russian Center in Brussels wants to support this wonderful tradition by organizing a round table devoted to discussing topical issues of students, a student concert and Russian “sbiten” - a “national” drink of Moscow University.
